Halls Creek 2016 Update

The ongoing challenge of restoring the health of the Halls Creek estuary while stemming the further deterioration of the protection offered by the Squaw Island barrier beach has not faded away. To the contrary, this past winter nature continued its assault on the Squaw Island barrier beach. The buildup of sand in the creek stands unabated with the westernmost sandbar increasing in size by almost a third.

These conditions are not a surprise to most of the readers of this newsletter or to Halls Creek abutters in Hyannisport, Green Dunes and on Squaw Island. For that reason nearly 150 people attended the HCPF update at the Hyannisport Club late last August. Attendees were treated to a historical view of the changes in both the creek and at the barrier island over the last six decades or so. Volunteers from HCPF and its consulting engineers, BSC Engineering, were able to graphically demonstrate the physical changes to the estuary and its environs, and reinforced the need to take action.

At the time of the August update, two major tasks stood in the way of filing for the necessary permits to begin dredging the creek. The first, resampling the underlying deposits under the creek, took place in November and December. As was the case a few years earlier, the material "passed with flying colors." This means the testing showed the deposits throughout the creek were more that 90 percent sand. The ninety percent level is what determines whether the material can be dredged and placed safely at another site.

The second task involves gaining landowner approval to place the spoils from the creek dredging onto the Squaw Island barrier beach. Four parcels of land comprise the barrier beach. Three of the parcel landowners have expressed tentative support for the project but for various reasons, have not yet signed the necessary documentation we need to accompany our application for permitting. Unfortunately, the parcels owned by the three landowners comprise less than one-half of the island. The team of volunteers actively involved in this project continues to work toward getting the full support of all four landowners.

Continue to look for ongoing communications about the Halls Creek Preservation Fund project and why this effort is critically important to protecting our neighborhood and our property.

To make it easier to send these out to each Seaside Park homeowner, the placards are left blank. Please add your street and home number in the bottom space using a **permanent marker**. Your street would be first and your home number next, separated by a dash.

For example, if you live at 25 First Ave., you would put 1-25 in the white blank space at the bottom. If you live on one of the cross streets, you would put the first 3 letters of your street followed by a dash and your home number. For example, if you live on 25 Ocean Ave., you would put OCE-25 in the space.
